On your Expedition cruise, on shore excursions and on board, lectures will be provided by knowledgeable, expert members of the crew.

The M/S Expedition has one of the highest ratios of expedition team members to guests - with one expert for every 10 guests there is always someone on hand to answer your questions and provide greater insight and appreciation of the world at its extremes. In addition to support staff there will be at least 14 expedition experts on board - specialising in everything from ornithology to marine biology. The expedition team is comprised of professional and highly skilled historians, marine biologists, and naturalists who offer keen insight and a unique personal perspective to each and every adventure. The Expedition staff will pilot the Zodiac landing craft used for shore landings and Zodiac cruises; they are experienced drivers who operate the Zodiacs in a responsible manner.

Trip summary

Venture into the high Arctic on a remarkable voyage from Spitsbergen to Iceland via Greenland's wild and seldom-visited coast. Your journey begins in Svalbard, a remote archipelago where towering cliffs host bustling bird colonies and polar bears roam the sea ice. From the ship's panoramic decks or during Zodiac excursions, keep watch for seals hauled out on ice floes and the unique Svalbard reindeer grazing along the shoreline.

As you navigate south, the dramatic beauty of the Arctic unfolds day by day. The transition is striking - from a world dominated by sea ice to the deep fjords and rugged peaks of Greenland. Along the ice's edge, summer brings rich feeding grounds for whales, and the chance to spot humpbacks, minkes or even orcas adds excitement to each mile travelled.

Greenland's eastern coastline offers one impressive highlight after another. Sail into the vast, secluded fjord systems of Northeast Greenland National Park - the largest national park on Earth and a place almost entirely inaccessible except by expedition ship. Landings reveal landscapes shaped by glaciers and time: sheer mountains rising from the water, ancient rock formations, and the crisp silence of true wilderness. In the Inuit community of Ittoqqortoormiit, you'll gain insight into life in one of the most remote settlements anywhere in the world.

Throughout the voyage, the M/S Expedition provides a relaxing and convivial base. Fully refurbished with upgraded engines, refreshed cabins - all with ensuite facilities - and inviting shared spaces, the ship blends comfort with adventure. Enjoy excellent international dining, unwind in the lounge or sauna, and join expert-led presentations in geology, ornithology, marine biology, and photography to deepen your understanding of this extraordinary environment.

From close-up encounters with icebergs and wildlife to the thrill of stepping ashore in places few have set foot, this is an adventure defined by contrast - ice and fire, solitude and discovery, the untamed Arctic giving way to Iceland's volcanic shores. A voyage of constant wonder, it promises memories to last a lifetime.

Special notes

Flights

If booking your own flights, you must arrive by 2:00pm, at the very latest, on embarkation day. On the last day, if you are flying home that day, your flight must depart no earlier than 2:00pm. We strongly encourage you to arrive the day before you embark. We can book additional night's accommodation in Longyearbyen and also in Reykjavik.

- The larger polar ships are not so flexible. They cannot get so close to the shore and they suffer from being too impersonal. M/S Expedition carries a maximum of 128 passengers, making it a very friendly experience
- M/S Expedition offers a high guest-to-expert ratio of 1:10. In addition to support staff there will be at least 14 expedition experts on board - specialising in everything from ornithology to marine biology

Your trip itinerary

Day 1: Arrive Longyearbyen. Shuttle bus to hotel.

Fly from London to Longyearbyen. On arrival, look out for our local representative who will direct you to the shuttle bus waiting outside. It's a very short drive from the airport to your hotel in the centre of town.

Tonight will be your first experience of the midnight sun (or a polar day) as the sun doesn't set between mid-April and mid-August in these extreme latitudes. For the duration of your cruise you will have continuous daylight, which does take a little getting used to!

Overnight: Svalbard Hotell - the Vault, Longyearbyen

Day 2: Drop your luggage at the meeting point. Free time in Longyearbyen. Return to the meeting point by 4:00pm for group transfer to the M/S Expedition. Embarkation.

After a leisurely breakfast you need to take your bags to the luggage drop at the Svalbard Hotell Polfareren in the centre of town. Drop off is between 09:00am and 1:00pm. You will then be free to explore Longyearbyen till embarkation at 4:00pm

The town of Longyearbyen is the largest settlement on the archipelago of Svalbard with a population of about 2,060 people and about as many snowmobiles. Longyearbyen is located at 78° 13' N 15° 33' E and has an arctic tundra climate. Due to its location, far north of the polar circle, it experiences polar night from mid-October to mid-February and polar day from mid-April to mid-August. While most of the inhabitants are Norwegian some are Russian. Located in the Advent Fjord at the entrance of the Advent Valley this community has an infrastructure fit for a much larger city. All settlements are found on the west coast, the part of Spitsbergen with the mildest climate due to the warm Gulf Current. Within the islands, there are four inhabited settlements and some scientific stations. Barentsburg, a Russian coal mining settlement, has approximately 850 inhabitants. Sveagruva, the functional Norwegian mine, has around 100 inhabitants, and Ny Ålesund, a scientific settlement, has between 30 and 150 inhabitants, depending on the season.



At 4:00pm there will be a passenger transfer from the meeting point to the M/S Expedition. Make sure you have your passport to hand.

If you are arranging your own flights, please ensure that they arrive by 2:00pm at the latest to ensure being on time for the embarkation.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: B D)

Day 3: Cruise Spitsbergen / Greenland Sea.

Over the next four days you will explore the Northwest Spitsbergen National Park, a small portion of the western coast of the Svalbard Archipelago. The itinerary is not fixed so that each day the cruise can take advantage of local ice and weather conditions seeking out the best that Svalbard has to offer. Distances are relatively short and seas relatively calm, allowing for a thorough exploration of the wealth of natural, historic and cultural sites in the area. You will visit ice-covered seas, fjords with breathtaking mountain scenery, and glaciers flowing into the surrounding sea.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 4: Cruise Spitsbergen / Greenland Sea.

You will spend much of your time around Spitsbergen in search of the elusive polar bears as they hunt seals. You will also keep a close lookout for Arctic foxes and Svalbard's unique subspecies of reindeer - although much smaller than their southern relatives, they still carry impressive antlers.

The Zodiacs will be primed and ready for one or two shore landings per day or to cruise around the ice floes. Ice permitting, spectacular bird cliffs filled with thousands of murres (guillemots), as well as kittiwakes and

glaucous gulls. A little auk colony will also be on your agenda. The plant life here has adapted to survive in this terrain and we will have the opportunity to observe and discuss some of their adaptations to what is considered a harsh environment.

This is also a land of history: from whaling to reaching for the pole, to trapping, coal mining and war. You will visit some of these historic sites.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 5: Cruise Spitsbergen / Greenland Sea.

You continue sailing through the Greenland Sea and exploring the coast of Spitsbergen.

Along with time for wildlife observation, the ship has a range of other resources you can enjoy during your cruise. Below deck, the ship's library has an array of literature to expand your knowledge, whilst a sauna and gym are available for those looking to keep fit and active. The ship's bar is a great place to relax and share the events of each day with your fellow travellers, and you may also enjoy live music in the evenings as well as many presentations throughout the voyage.

Meals are served in the spacious dining room and food is both plentiful and prepared to a very high standard.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)



Day 6: Cruise Spitsbergen / Greenland Sea

In between land and water excursions, be sure to make use of the large observation decks on the M/S Expedition. They will give superb views of the surrounding land and sea so keep your binoculars to hand.

As autumn is approaching, the days are getting shorter, so you'll need to take advantage of all the sunlight to look for wildlife.

Whilst on deck, you can also venture onto the bridge and meet the Captain and crew at any time.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 7: Cruise Greenland Sea / Scoresby Sund.

As you sail further south, into the Scoresby Sund, keep an eye out for whales, which are known to feed here in the summer months. You may spot Spot orca, humpback and minke whales, as well as dolphins.

Along with sea mammals we should also expect sightings of many sea birds such as kittiwakes and fulmars.

Frigid waters drain from the Arctic Ocean in a southwest current along the coast of northeast Greenland. Often drifting pack ice is pushed along the coast. The ship will attempt to approach and follow the pack ice edge to explore the polar seascape. .

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 8: Cruise Greenland Sea / Scoresby Sund

Along with wildlife viewing from the observation decks and Zodiac tours, you can enjoy daily lectures presented by experts from the M/S Expedition team on a range of subjects including wildlife, geology, photography and the history and exploration of the Arctic.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 9: Cruise Scoresby Sund / Denmark Strait.

The ship will sail through and land in some of the most spectacular fjord country in the world, down the coast of Greenland, while exploring rarely visited glaciers, bays and inlets. This is the Northeast Greenland National Park - the largest and most northerly national park in the world. It is nearly impossible to reach except on expedition ships.

Spectacular geology combined with glacial features create steep mountains raising directly from the sea. Look out for picturesque scenery, wildlife and other interesting landing sites in this unspoiled wilderness. Depending on ice, spend these days exploring the massive fjord system of the region, which includes portions of Scoresby Sund. These intricate fjord systems are everything from wide and unimaginable to narrow and steeply spectacular with some of the best mountain scenery in the world. Walking over lush stands of colourful autumn tundra may lead to opportunities to see muskox grazing nearby.

You may visit the tiny settlement of Ittoqqortoormiit for a look at how these most northerly people live. This isolated town in Greenland is far from any other inhabited settlements and is only accessible by expedition ships three months of the year. The town's population of 450 rely on hunting and fishing as they only have one grocery store. Locals enjoy the warmer spring weather and sunshine by taking dog sled or snowmobile trips as well as camping.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 10: Cruise Scoresby Sund / Denmark Strait.

The ship will continue sailing along the east coast of Greenland, making frequent stops and exploring the sea and land, by Zodiac and on foot.

Each day will undoubtedly bring new and exciting wildlife sightings and endless opportunities for photographing the beautiful ice-clad landscape.



Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 11: Cruise Scoresby Sund / Denmark Strait.

Your cruise continues south along the eastern coast of Greenland with plenty of opportunity for exploration and observation along the way.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 12: Cruise Scoresby Sund / Denmark Strait.

Continue to sail south along the east coast of Greenland.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 13: Cruise Scoresby Sund / Denmark Strait.

Continue your voyage sailing south along the east coast of Greenland.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 14: Cruise the Denmark Strait to Reykjavik

Cruising now through the Denmark Strait, the ship is nearing Iceland and the steaming hot springs of Reykjavík.

Although, sadly coming towards the end of your Arctic adventure there is still time for more wildlife spotting. Views from the large observation decks are often complemented by passing whales and soaring birds including fulmars, kittiwakes, gannets, guillemots and razorbills.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 14: Cruise to to Reykjavik.

This is your last day on board the M/S Expedition and your last chance to enjoy the great facilities onboard and to take some final photos of the wildlife and scenery.

Overnight: M / S Expedition (Meals: BLD)

Day 15: Disembark M/S Expedition. Morning transfer to airport Fly Reykjavik to London.

Today, after breakfast you will sadly say farewell to the M/S Expedition and disembark in Reykjavík at the cruise terminal. There will be a complimentary transfer to Keflavik Airport at 8:00am for all passengers who have flights booked today. If you are arranging your own flights, please do not book them before 12:00pm today.

All transfer arrangements will be confirmed while onboard, prior to departure, to ensure that all needs are met.

If you wish to extend your time in Reykjavik we can book hotel nights and suggest activities to enjoy in this cosmopolitan and lively city. **(Meals: B)**

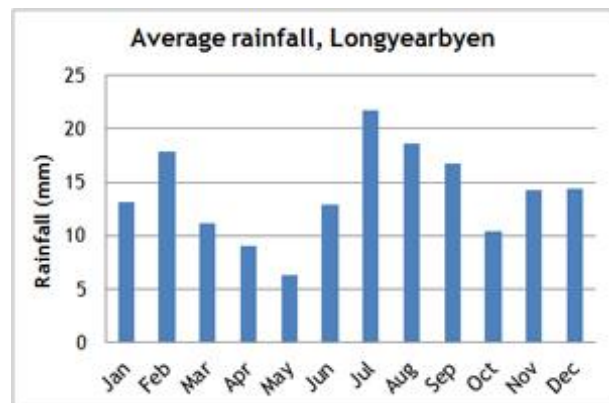
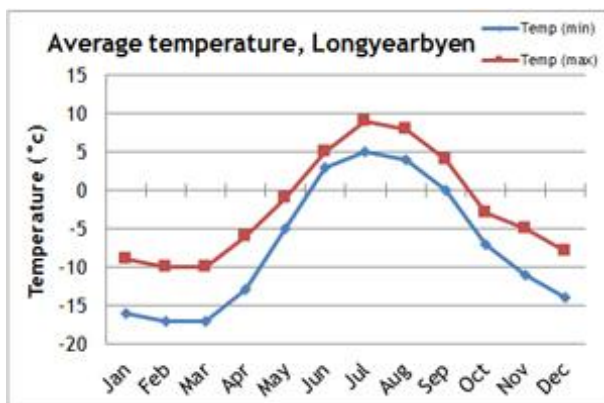

RESPONSIBLE TOURISM STATEMENT

For almost four decades, Mountain Kingdoms has been offering people the chance to visit amazing places on this extraordinary planet. We now have trips to all corners of the globe but are conscious that our holidays can have a detrimental impact on the world around us and want to do all we can to reduce that.

We have focused our main responsible tourism efforts on reducing the carbon emissions produced by our holidays, and counterbalancing this carbon by supporting carbon offset measures. Here are some of our current and future plans to minimise the impact of our business as a whole.

Carbon offsetting

Since 2007, we have donated a percentage of our client and staff flight costs to the Ecoan tree planting project in Peru. Ecoan are a trusted local NGO who use the funds directly to purchase seedling trees with the long-term goal of restoring 2.5 million acres of Andean land.

Ecoan maintains over 100 tree nurseries across Peru where their tree saplings are grown and then transported to planting sites during the rainy season. They use native trees such as the Polylepis, as these can survive at high altitudes. As well as sequestering carbon, they help protect against soil erosion, landslides and the effects of extreme weather on local crops. As such, they are enormously beneficial to the economic well-being of the surrounding communities. This is very much a community-led conservation project, with the local Quechuan people coming together to plant tens of thousands of saplings in the Andean highlands where they live. During the annual Queuña Raymi (tree festival), over 150,000 native trees can be planted in a single day!

For every person booking a long-haul, flight inclusive holiday with us, Ecoan can purchase and plant 20 trees in Peru, and for short-haul flights, 7 trees. Typically, we send over \$7,000 per year to Ecoan, which is over 7,000 trees.

Reducing carbon emissions

- ✓ We offer the majority of our clients a free, filtered Water-to-Go bottle to help reduce the need for single-use plastic bottles during their travels.
- ✓ We predominantly use locally-owned hotels and guesthouses rather than multinational chains. In some of our destinations, such as Bhutan, we use homestays. Not only does this type of small-sized, locally-owned accommodation have a much-reduced carbon footprint, but it also helps support communities.
- ✓ We evaluate our flights to make sure we are using the most fuel-efficient airlines with the youngest fleets and, where possible, choose direct flights for each trip.
- ✓ We have stopped offering unnecessary optional flights, such as Everest sightseeing. We try to minimise internal flights where possible.
- ✓ We recycle as much of our office waste as possible and have introduced a client portal to reduce paperwork and to make it easier for clients to manage their trips online.

Wider commitment to responsible and sustainable tourism

- ✓ We are signatories to the Tourism Declares a Climate Emergency initiative to stand alongside other like-minded travel companies to initiate best practices to make tourism as sustainable as possible.
- ✓ We will continue to support several charities with whom we have a long-standing relationship, such as Shiva Charity in Nepal.
- ✓ Over the years, we have given sizeable payments to emergency relief when a disaster has occurred in the countries we operate in. We always try to ensure that these funds go directly to those who need them most to help rebuild their lives.
