


# Wadi Rum



## Extension Option - Jordan



For the complete Jordan experience, why not add extra nights amidst the magnificent desert landscape of Wadi Rum at the end of your Dana to Petra group holiday.

Known for its connection with the enigmatic British officer, T.E. Lawrence, Wadi Rum is a fascinating place to explore. Its vast, open, red-hued sands are seemingly punctured by rock outcrops (jebels) rising steeply from the desert floor. Amongst the jebels you'll discover that both nature and man have left their imprint on this land, with numerous rock arches and petroglyphs to be seen. Staying for 2 or 3 nights in a desert camp you will enjoy the generous hospitality of your Bedouin hosts and take desert walks that reveal the stark, beguiling beauty of Wadi Rum

### Suggested Itinerary - 2 nights in Wadi Rum

#### Day 1 - Transfer from Petra to Wadi Rum. Jeep ride.

After a morning at Petra, you will say farewell to your fellow trekkers and drive to the desert camp at Wadi Rum. From here you will board a jeep and drive out into the valley to begin your exploration of the remarkable desert landscape.

Overnight: Panorama desert Camp (Meals: B L D)

#### Day 2 - Walk in Wadi Rum - 4 hours. Picnic lunch. Time at leisure.

After a good breakfast you will head out for a walk that will cover a distance of around 12-15 km. Wadi Rum is a truly beautiful place where great towers of rock, set on a carpet of red sand, have been eroded into fantastical gnarled shapes. During your walk you can explore the distinctive rock formations and perhaps climb to the top of a large dune or arch for far-reaching views of the lunar-like landscape.

## **Day 3 - Drive to Madaba with a stop at the Dead Sea en route.**

Leaving Wadi Rum you drive first of all to the famous Dead Sea, bordered by Jordan to the east and Israel and Palestine to the west. The Dead Sea is located 430m/1,412ft below sea level and is nearly nine times as salty as the ocean. You should have time for a swim there to experience for yourself the super buoyancy that this salinity causes. You will then continue north to Madaba and end your holiday with a farewell dinner.

**Day 4 - Transfer to the airport. Fly to London (Meals: B)**

### **Day 3 - Barrah Canyon walk - 2½ hours. Picnic lunch. Optional camel ride.**

If you want to enjoy some additional walking or activities, we can include a further day and night in Wadi Rum. On this extra day you would walk through Barrah Canyon and have the option to go camel riding while there (payable locally). At the end of your activities you will return to camp for a final night under the vast desert skies.

Overnight: Panorama desert Camp (Meals: B L D)

### **Day 4 - Drive to Madaba with a stop at the Dead Sea en route.**
